











Largest Population within 90 minutes

2005 – Helena has the largest population within a 90-minute drive of any city in Montana (Study done by the Mt. Office of Tourism, MT Dept. of Transportation, and MT Aeronautics Dept. (226,000 people) (note: doesn't include Missoula, 15 minutes further)

For the second year in a row, Montana is ranked 6th in the nation for best business climate (www.taxfoundation.org). The index takes into account over one hundred variables including corporate taxes, individual income taxes, sales tax (there is none), unemployment insurances and property taxes.
